# COOKS

SWEET 'N' SOUR PUNGENT PRAWNS

1/4 cup brown sugar, firmly packed 2 tbsp. cornstarch 1/2 tsp. salt 1/4 cup vinegar 1 tbsp. soy sauce 1/4 tsp. ground ginger 19 oz. can pineapple chunks 1 green pepper, cut into strips 3 lbs. prawns, shelled


In a saucepan mix sugar, cornstarch and salt. Add the vinegal soy sauce, ginger and syrup drained from pineapple, cook slowly until slightly thickened, stirring constantly. Add the green pepper, onion and pineapple and simmer 2 minutes. Add the shelled prawns, bring to a boil stirring constantly, and cook 2 minutes.

Serve immediately with or over hot steamed rice.


