

Navigator, Weather, Marine Maintenance and Marine Electronics are not being offered this training year. The reason for this being insufficient numbers in the classes. A concensus of opinion from instructors, past & present indicates it is not practical unless a class of five or more can be arranged. These courses will be offered again next year.

One class is currently underway for Instuctor Training & another to commence in Jan. with Carol Quartermain as instructor.

All the classes listed above are in full session & progressing enthusiastically. In the Boating Courses we have 116 enrolled in Richmond & 98 enrolled in Ladner for a total of 214. This 79/80 Training season shows an increase of well over 30% from the past two or three years.

Our training staff this year numbers 45 members, this included training officers, instructors, proctors & assistants on a reg. basis but does not include guest speakers, occassional assistants or any other assistance outside C.P.S. membership.

A tremendous vote of thanks and appreciation to all those actively supporting Fraser's Training program & especially to Bruce Bell from Van. Squadron who is helping us in Rich.

Scuba diving may harm unborn

According to a Texas researcher, scuba or skin diving is likely to severely harm fetuses in pregnant women. It's a serious matter, for the number of women divers is increasing at 20% a year. Experiments with sheep, which are more resistant to the bends than humans, showed that in dives over 60 feet the risk of harming the fetus, perhaps fatally, is high.
