

FROM THE BRIDGE


The Annual General Meeting of Fraser Power Squadron will take place on Friday, April 24, 1981, at the Town and Country Inn, at 2000 hours.

It is at this meeting that the annual reports of Officers are presented and a new Bridge is elected.


Additionally, we expect to have a well known guest (Tom Thompson of Molsons Marine Patrol) talk to us of his many interesting experiences on the water.







WATCH OUT FOR HER WAKE!

Allis-Chalmers of Milwaukee is now building, under licence, the large Sulzer marine diesels to be installed in American cargo ships. This Swiss designed engine is similar to the 8 & W giant. It has a 35" bore x 61" stroke and develops 43,200 h.p. at 126 r.p.m. Each of the 12 connecting rods is 12½ ft. long and weighs 5½ tons. The crankshaft weighs 115 tons. This class of engine has an extremely low fuel consumption and will burn the poorest of residual fuel oils which are almost solid at room temperatures. Fuel has risen to become 60% of the running cost of a large ship and is second only to the amortization of the capital investment in the overall cost of operating a ship. The American President Lines ship for which the A-C/Sulzer engine is being built will be 860 ft. long with a service speed of 24.5 knots when loaded with 2500 standard containers each 20 ft. long.
