Commander's Report

Fellow Bridge Members;

On March 5, 2007 I attended the PMD bridge meeting at Willingdon church.

It was announced that Boatshow attendance was up 5%-6% this year.

In an attempt to increase membership, USPS has eliminated the requirement of writing an exam to join the squadron. CPS has been looking at methods to increase membership and it's been suggested that membership be included in the Boating class fee. The squadrons of PMD soundly disagree with this proposal. Offering a membership for nothing puts a value of nothing on said membership. At renewal time, even fewer people will want to shell out money for something with no worth. It was pointed out that sign-up rates were consistent and that the problem lay with retaining members. If CPS wants to increase membership we (national) should be looking at what it takes to retain members.

A slightly different issue that was raised pertained to people who have taken the Boating class many years ago and are now looking for a PCOC. In many cases these people have let their membership lapse. Sign them up! Why? National will charge them \$20 to research and issue a PCOC, a \$43 membership renewal will get them their PCOC, 6 months of Pacific Yachting and it just may get us a grateful enthusiastic new member.

It was also noted that the United States has proposed to drop DSC in favour of AIS. If this happens I will give DSC a 0% survival rate in Canada. On the topic of VHF, it was noted that BC Coast Guard will be moving their working channel from 22A to 83A.

I will forward the PMD bridge reports to the Fraser bridge.

A few miscellaneous items from the PMD bridge:

Misc

- The ever popular Vancouver Squadron BilgeWater Bash is slated for Friday, March 31, at the Royal Vancouver Yacht club. Tickets are \$60/person and there were still some left.
- The PMD Rendezvous at Snug Cove is scheduled for July 6, 7, 8. This years theme is "Pirates of the Caribean".

Training

- I have a feeling we are in for a bumpy ride with boating course materials. Some squadrons received a mixture of older and new course materials (this is despite the fact that National swore up and down that due to the way the printer handles things this was impossible. The addendum to bring the older material up to date is 55 double sided pages!
- There is also mixtures of old and new VHF course materials.
- The bottom line is we need to be vigilant about what materials we receive.
- It was mentioned that when squadron order material from national that if the order is less than \$150 the squadron pays the shipping. For orders over \$150, national picks up the tab. If it's requested that orders over \$150 be couriered out then the squadron will pick up the difference in shipping from regular post to the courier rate.
