Accomplishments:

- Regarding the Chinese program, Jack Tang recently had 10 students write their PCOC on August 14 at the WestCan Yacht Club. This exam was invigilated by Kathleen and Paul and the student registrations and exam results were entered into WBAS. All successful students should have received their permanent boating operator's card by now. The next PCOC exam for the Chinese students will be Tuesday evening, Sept 17 at 8pm at which time 20 students will be writing their exam.
- We have submitted a Read-o-graph request to the City of Delta for the week of Sept 9, advising of upcoming 'boating' courses and the Squadron phone number that people can call for further information (604-786-5678)
- The Boating Basics, Boating Essentials, and the VHF courses have been entered into WBAS so
 that people can register online. They have also been entered on the Fraser Squadron Facebook
 page and on the Fraser Squadron webpage. Notifications of these courses will also be going out
 on Twitter in advance of each course.
- Online registration appears to be 'working': we have 2 registrants (a couple) who have paid for the Boating Essentials in Richmond starting Oct 22. We also have 1 person who is apparently interested in this same course, but has not as yet contacted us.
 - For the VHF Radio course (Oct 2 and 9), we have 2 people who have registered online. We also have 6 people from the WestCan Yacht Club (Jack's group) who are apparently interested in this course; there has been no registration as yet.
- Bob Juulsen and Bill Hawryluk have been coordinating their schedules and setting up instructors and proctors. The Boating Basics (BB) course will be 5 weeks in length; the Boating Essentials course will be 9 weeks in length (this includes a practical on the Steveston Lifeboat). The *draft* schedule for both Ladner and Richmond is attached. We will be holding the PCOC exam for both groups at the WestCan Yacht Club on Saturday, Oct 26 10:30 12noon, so as to free up time for both the Boating Basics and the Boating Essentials courses.
 - **Registration for the Richmond BB course will be on Sept 17 and for the Ladner BB course will be Sept 19. Kathleen and Paul will be attending to help with registration. Nan will help with the Ladner registration.
- We anticipate the graduation ceremony for our successful students to be held sometime in January or February, but this, of course, is open to discussion. We might elect to have one grad event sometime in May or June of next year.
- Bill Hawryluk has enough Boating Basics books for the first class; we have ordered 15 copies of the BB student CD's and these will be delivered in time for this course.
- Kathleen and Paul will be away from Sept 28 to Oct 24. Nan Lockie has agreed to monitor the Squadron phone during this time.
